James's Community Care Center medical provider referred him to psychiatric services for medication management and psychotherapy services. James attended treatment for a year, is no longer suffering from panic attacks, and is enjoying a great relationship with his son.
- Monica's turnaround: At a visit to the CCC, Monica showed a significant increase in her A1C (blood glucose level). Dr. Maloney, one of our volunteer providers, talked with her about the seriousness of the situation, switched her medication, and discussed the importance of changing her diet immediately. At her follow-up visit 4 months later, her A1C had dropped more than 7.7 points! She was consistently taking her medication as prescribed and making substantial changes to her diet. Now Monica feels better and is living a healthier life.

These stories are just two examples of the countless lives that have been touched by your generosity over the past 25 years. Together, we have made a difference, and together, we will continue to build a healthier, more compassionate community.

JESUS'S JOURNEY

When Jesus Garcia received his prostate cancer diagnosis, his world turned upside down. The extensive surgery that followed left him bedridden, and he was told he wouldn't walk again. Despite the grim prognosis, Jesus's spirit remained unbroken. Jesus's story is one of resilience, community support, and the incredible impact of collaborative healthcare.

Jesus's journey to recovery began with the exceptional care he received at Atrium Health Wake Forest Baptist Hospital. His wife, who stood by his side as his primary caregiver, found support through Health Care Access. This organization made sure that Jesus had access to the necessary medical supplies and resources during his recovery. Their assistance was invaluable in managing the day-to-day challenges of his condition.



The turning point in Jesus's recovery came when he was introduced to the Community Care Center (CCC). The CCC provided surgery follow ups, pain management, physical therapy, and mental health services tailored to Jesus's unique needs. Through consistent medical care, Jesus began to make remarkable progress. He moved from the bed to a wheelchair, then a walker, and at his last visit, he walked in with a cane and a big smile on his face. Jesus is determined to walk on his own, and his care team is confident that he will accomplish his goal.

Reflecting on his journey, Jesus shared, "I went through this for a reason – and I want to use my story to show the need for a place like the Community Care Center." His words resonate deeply with the mission of the CCC, highlighting the critical role it plays in the lives of patients like him.

Jesus's wife expressed profound gratitude for the seamless collaboration between Atrium Health, Health Care Access, Cancer Services, and the Community Care Center. "Without the support of these four organizations, we wouldn't be where we are today," she said. "They came together to give Jesus a second chance at life."

My mom first came to the Community Care Center for help managing her diabetes. She has received so much more.

My mom first came to the Community Care Center for help managing her diabetes. She has received so much more. Due to constant knee pain, she could not enjoy her normal activities. She was initially treated with injections, but when the problem persisted and the pain prevented her from walking, she was referred to an orthopedic surgeon who analyzed her situation and health condition and recommended a knee replacement.

The Community Care Center supported my mom throughout the entire process. She had the surgery and received physical therapy at Novant Health facilities. The care, attention, and support she received were of the highest quality. She now has a better quality of life, she can walk without pain, and despite the limitations of her age, she can perform and enjoy activities that previously were out of the question.

The ongoing care my mom receives from the Community Care Center is priceless. From helping her obtain her medications to supporting her emotional and mental well-being, I am so grateful to the whole team of staff and volunteers who care for her with dignity and kindness.

Ron Miller Ann Flynt Award




